RESERVATIONS FOR THE REUNION, HOTEL AND TOURS, MUST BE IN BY AUGUST 28th

The time for registering for the Reunion is upon us. Now we need shipmates who are going to attend, to make their registrations with the hotel, and send in their Association Form with tour(s) and banquet requests to Joe Hill. The Horton Grand Hotel will host our reunion from Monday, October 8 thru Friday, October 12. This is not a large hotel, like the main chains, but more on the boutique style...more intimate and friendly. **Reservations must be made via the telephone 800-542-1886.** You must indicate you are registering with the Rochester Reunion. The rate for the room is \$125.00 per night. If you try to register on line, you will get a message there is no rooms available for those dates. We have blocked them for reunion members attending.

PARKING

For those driving to San Diego there are various areas for parking. The Horton Grand Hotel has valet parking at \$25.00 per day with in and out privileges. There are also a number of parking garages and open lots that have parking with varied parking rates. Rates vary by the time of day during a 24 hour period but average out to be between \$18.00 to \$25.00 but do not have in and out privileges.

ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE WITH A PARKING GARAGE AT **289 6TH AVE.** THAT IS LOCATED 5 BLOCKS (TWO BLOCKS IN ONE DIRECTION AND THREE IN ANOTHER) FROM THE HOTEL. THEY WILL CHARGE A FEE OF ABOUT \$13.00 PER 24 HOUR PERIOD WITH NO IN AND OUT PRIVILEGES. PARK YOUR CAR UPON ARRIVAL AND PICK UP WHEN YOU LEAVE BEFORE 6PM ON FRIDAY.

US citizens need a valid US Passport, US Passport Card, Trusted Travelers Card or state issued Enhanced Driver's License to get back into the US.

Each visitor to Mexico is allowed to purchase up to \$800 US dollars of duty-free merchandise free including up to one liter or one quart of alcoholic beverage or beer. Additional items can be purchased by paying duty and IRT on these items. Upon return to the United States from Mexico, US citizens need a valid U.S. Passport, U.S. Passport Card, Trusted Travelers Card or state issued Enhanced Driver's License. A valid passport, I-94, Multiple Entry Visa or Resident Alien Card is required for non-USA citizens. Canadian citizens should have identification required when entering the U.S. from Canada. The U.S. Border Agent must ask each guest to state his/her citizenship and tell about his/her purchases. Before getting off the motorcoach, guests will be instructed to collect all of his/her possessions -- nothing can be left of the motorcoach. You will be escorted through the check area and met at the exit door. The motorcoach will be checked by the Border Agents and proceed to pick you up on the American side of the border. 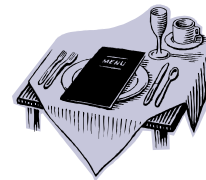
